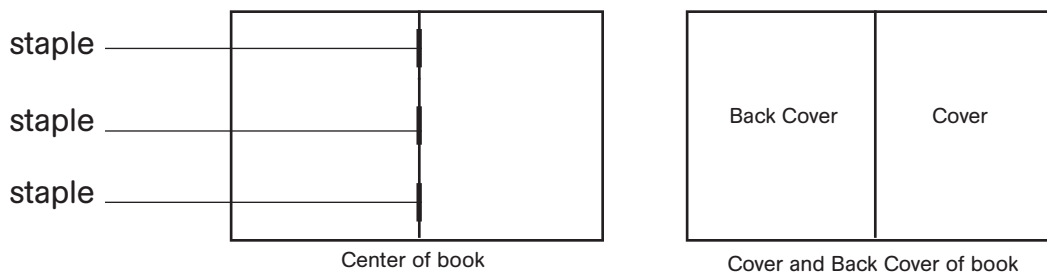


### Objectives:

#### 1. Use the WorryWoo storyboard pages for word placement and scene development.

Tip: The storyboard helps layout ideas for creating pages in the WorryWoo book. Take your time coming up with placement of images and copy, but remember these are not your final pages. Don't spend too much time on drawing details. Copy storyboard pages as needed.

#### 3. Draw your cover on a separate heavy sheet of paper. Attach with glue.

Tip: Cover image (front picture) and back cover should be drawn on the same sheet of folded paper.

- Cover goes on the right side of the fold, back cover on the left. See above diagram.
